October 14, 2019

Mayor Glenn Wunderlich presided

1. Council Members present Norma Bukoveckas, Ray Bukoveckas, Steve Nelson, and Dave Widhalm.

Town Staff present Andrea Bowie, Deputy Clerk/ Treasurer

Mayor Wunderlich brought the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

2. Mayor Wunderlich led the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Aldermen N. Bukoveckas motioned to table the September 9, 2019 Regular Council meeting minutes until the next regular Town council meeting November 13, 2019.
Aldermen D. Widhalm seconded. Mayor Wunderlich called for a vote on the motion.
Motion carried unanimously.
4. Mayor Wunderlich called for any corrections or additions to the September 23, 2019 special meeting minutes. None heard. Alderman R. Bukoveckas moved to approve September 23, 2019 regular council meeting minutes. Alderman S. Nelson seconded.
Mayor Wunderlich called for a vote on the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

5. Public Comment.

Nita Tomscheck asked about the snowflake Christmas lights getting new bulbs and if they have been done. She was informed that half of the lights have been purchased and the

other half are on back order thru Devos. As soon as the snowflakes have all new LED bulbs, they will be amp tested by Northwestern Energy for billing purposes.

6. Discussion on plowing the Town streets.

Mayor Wunderlich opened discussion on plowing emergency routes only, not plowing all the streets. There have been multiple complaints on plowing leaving rocks and gravel in yards. Rick Tomscheck said he would rather leave the snow, brought up that Shelby doesn't plow there streets just emergency routes.

7. Library Report.

Waiting on surety to award contract on bid to complete addition.

8. Law Enforcement Report

No law enforcement present at the Town Council meeting and the report was passed around for all to view. Some of the highlights include: 12 traffic complaints, 4 citations/warnings issued, 120 business security checks, 1 traffic crash assists, 1 dog complaint, 17 bar checks, 3 theft calls, 6 medical emergency, 1 burn permits, 2 fire calls, 4 citizen/motorist assist/ rides home, 1 welfare checks/ civil standby, 1 lost/ found property, 2 suspicious persons, 15 campground pavilion boat ramp checks.

9. Public Works Report.

The Town pumped 2,510,100 gallons of water for the month, for an average of 83,670 gallons per day. Bulk water sold 41,000 gallons for the month. The water sample was good for the month. The water levels in the wells are about average for this time of year. This month the Public works had an engineer meeting, cleaned out drainage areas, street sweeper, equipment maintenance grader, sweeper, compressor, Deere tractor, loader,

Conrad run for parts, flare mowed, cleaned shop, water distribution system samples, culverts, wastewater collection system estimate, winterizing irrigation lines.
